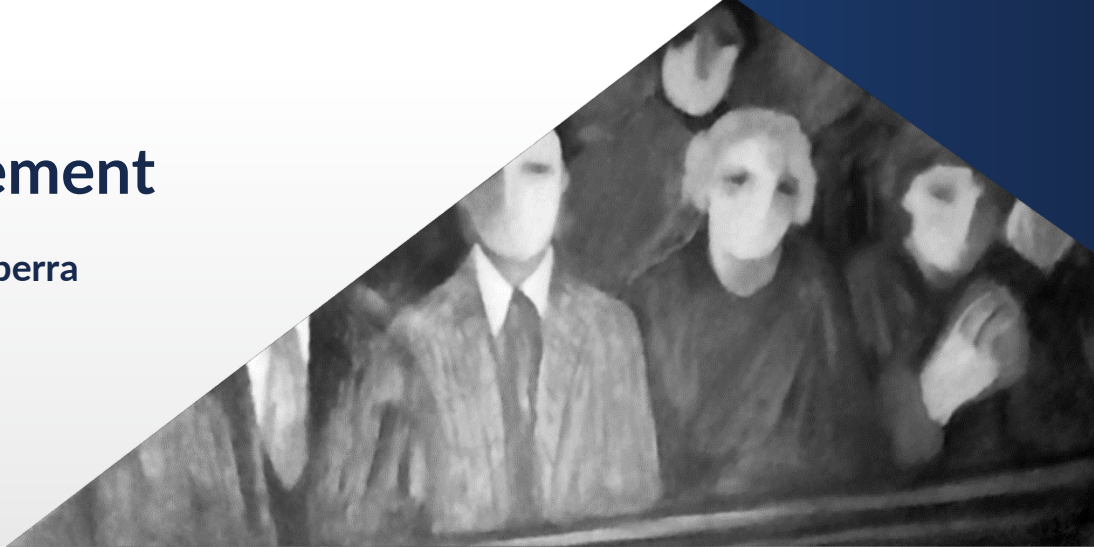


Jury Management

About the program

The National Judicial College of Australia will present a one and one half day seminar on Jury Management to enable judges to develop more effective and efficient jury management practices.

The purpose of this program is to look at ways of dealing with the many practical issues connected with managing a jury.

Sessions include the Juror's Journey, Achieving Excellence in Jury Directions, The Jury Trial from Hell, and Better Oral Communications with the Jury.

Participating judicial officers will gain an understanding of the juror's perspective, discuss the key aspects of jury directions, consider aides to directions and learn how to manage difficulties that arise at all stages of a trial.
